Goal

As an idea facilitator, you're expert in a particular challenge. You will be available to answer questions about "your" challenge and support the team in developing a better understanding of the problem. In addition, you will give suggestions for further work on the challenge.

How does it work?

On 1 November you will receive information on how to use moodle as well as login details for using Zoom.

Professional support: Especially at the beginning of the hackathon, you'll share your professional expertise to a specific challenge and support the participants in team building and first idea brainstorming. It is important to actively encourage participants in the projects to work together while also keeping the initial problem in mind. The explanation of the challenge and answering questions gives participants ideas on how to approach and solve their problems – and you are also welcome to contribute your own ideas to the challenge to start the discussion! At the end of team building process, it is important to set a goal for further work, to outline necessary tasks and to distribute responsibilities.

During the hackathon, you can take active part in your challenge or just stay in the background and let the team work on its own. Depending on how much time you can devote to the hackathon, it would be nice if you could also be approachable for the teams during the course of the hackathon.

Time commitment

We and the teams are thrilled to have you on board! You decide how much time you want to dedicate to the hackathon and how you want to share your expertise and offer support. Naturally, we don't expect anybody to actively participate in the hackathon for a full two days straight. What matters is that you **make your availability transparent** to your team by either using our communication channels on moodle or by directly telling the times you'll be available.
