GLOSSARY



CENTRAL TEAM

The Central Team is the DigiEduHack crew in charge of taking care and answering all the hosts' needs.

GOVERNANCE BODIES

Governance bodies are composed by the National Ambassadors Network (NAN) and the members of the Steering Group (SG). For more information about who they are and their tasks go to www.digieduhack.com.

HACKATHON

A hackathon - or a DigiEduHack event - is a “local” online/in-person/blended happening that gathers participants around a challenge and features speakers, mentors, a jury, a competition... The outcome of a hackathon is to get together, share, care and select one winning solution attempting to solve the hackathon’s challenge.

HOST

A host is the organisation/institution/team which is running (hosting) the hackathon.

PARTICIPANTS

A participant is anyone, regardless of their age or background, who is interested in digital education, and who wants to join this global movement of digital education enthusiasts, by contributing to finding solutions to the proposed hackathon challenges.

HOW TO REGISTER AS A USER?



Before becoming a participant to a challenge, you have to register on the website. **Three ways** of doing it:

REGISTRATION PROCESS



Three easy steps:

Fill-in the registration form to which you are redirected to **create a user**.

Although it is not mandatory, we recommend you fill in the “phone” section since this will help the Central Team contact you more easily in case there is any urgency related to your Hackathon.

Go to **your email inbox** and **click on the link you** just received from DigiEduHack to **activate your account**.



It may take some time for the email to get in your inbox or it may go into your spam folder. In case you do not receive the activation link within 12h, please contact the Central Team at contact@digieduhack.com.



You have 24h to activate your account since the moment you receive the activation email, in case you don't do it, you need to contact the Central Team at contact@digieduhack.com, so they reactivate the link.

Go back to www.digieduhack.com and **log in** with your email address and password.

Host a Hackathon

You want to propose a solution to a challenge?

Become a participant

Before becoming a participant to a challenge you can:

- Modify your personal information from “*Account details*”
- Become a participant by clicking on “*become a participant*” (you will be redirected to the challenges page, where you can pick your challenge)

After being accepted as a participant to a challenge, you can:

- Join the public Discord server and, follow the instructions within the “*join-your-event*” channel to join the specific channel created for your chosen challenge.
- Have the possibility to submit a solution

REGISTER TO A CHALLENGE



For you to become a participant, follow the next steps:

1. Once you are logged-in, click on the “*become a participant*” button.
2. Browse in the list of challenges and select the challenge of your choice; on the challenge page you will find the “*register button*”.



3. Fill-in the participant registration form: make sure you specify whether you are joining with a pre-existing team or solo, this information is highly valuable for your chosen host.

Registering to a challenge does not necessarily mean you became a participant. The host of your challenge may refuse your participation (e.g.: if the challenge is only open for university students and you are an educator requesting to join). Make sure you check the “who can join” section in the challenge page before registering.

3. You will receive an email informing you about the acceptance or refusal of your participation, including the link to your challenge’s Discord server.

Once you are registered on Discord, and have accessed the DigiEduHack public server, go to the “**Join your event**” channel and follow the instructions to join your local hackathon’s section.

Within your event section, you will find several channels:

Event Community channel

If you are looking for general information or resources or have any question about your hackathon, this is where you can find all the information

Matchmaking_networkingchannel

If you are looking for a team or teammates, this is the place to be!

Event Community voice channel

Allows voice and video interaction with your peers, host and mentors and judges.
